She also serves as the Physician Health Liaison for Northwestern Medicine and is a member of the Graduate Medical Education Committee. She is certified by the ABPN in Psychiatry and participates in continuing certification. As Chair of the ABPN, Dr. Anzia also serves as Chair of the Psychiatry Council and many other ABPN Committees.

She also serves as the liaison for the American Board of Family Medicine, American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) Committee on Continuing Certification and as the ABMS Meeting Attendee. Dr. Anzia is a Fellow and Chair of the Finance Committee for the American College of Physicians, a Past President of the Association of Academic Psychiatry, and a Past President of the Illinois Psychiatric Society.

Dr. Anzia succeeds John B. Bodensteiner, MD, a nationally recognized child neurologist who practiced for many years at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.

Dr. Brashear is Vice President for Health Sciences and Dean of the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences at the University at Buffalo in Buffalo, N.Y. She is an internationally renowned neurologist and researcher whose work has fundamentally transformed the way spasticity and dystonia are treated. A powerful advocate for promoting diverse leaders in medicine, Dr. Brashear was instrumental in creating one of the first national leadership programs in neurology for women.

She is certified by the ABPN in Neurology and participates in continuing certification. As Vice Chair of the ABPN, Dr. Brashear also serves as Chair of the Neurology Council and many other ABPN Committees.

She is also the ABPN liaison to the Leadership Council of Neurological Societies, the Association of University Professors of Neurology (AUPN), and American Neurological Association (ANA). Dr. Brashear is a trustee of the McKnight Brain Research Foundation and has served on the American Academy of Neurology (AAN) Board of Directors, the ANA Board of Directors, and the AUPN Board of Directors.

Dr. Brashear succeeds Jeffrey M. Lyness, MD, formerly the Senior Associate Dean for Academic Affairs and Professor of Psychiatry and Neurology at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry in Rochester, N.Y.

Dr. Lyness became President and CEO of the ABPN on Jan. 1, 2023, succeeding Larry R. Faulkner, MD, who retired after serving 16 years with the ABPN.


